



Tour Our Facility

Windsor Hills is a 230 acre wooded sanctuary in south-central New Hampshire. About a hundred of those acres show "varying signs of development," while the rest remain untouched. There are approximately 30 buildings nestled in the forest, the central cluster comfortably winterized for all season use.

The Inn at Windsor

The Inn at Windsor was placed into service in 2003. Providing meeting space, the 225 seat McLain Chapel, and 22 hotel-like rooms, the Inn is our most popular retreating facility. Handicap-accessible, the Inn is also home to the Nielson Renewal Wing, a special suite for pastoral and educational encouragement. Rooms have private baths and come furnished with linens.



Burgess Hall

Burgess Hall perfectly accommodates groups on a budget. This dormitory-style lodge has four rooms with five bunk beds each, all attached to a central meeting room. The building is within easy walking distance to the cafeteria/gym. Many youth groups return to Burgess Hall year after year, especially in winter and during school vacations.



The Eagle's Nest Retreat House

The Eagle's Nest Retreat House is a new addition to our winter line up. This five bedroom home can comfortably sleep 15 people. It comes with a small domestic kitchen, three rooms for meetings and lounging, and three bathrooms, all on two floors. The Eagle's Nest is perfect for Church Board Retreats or ministry leadership team meetings.



The Bear Den

The Bear Den is another recent addition that creates opportunities for even smaller groups to have a private setting. This retreat house is also available as an add-on for groups whose numbers place them close to the capacity of our other retreat buildings. Three bedrooms, one bath, living room and dining room, can accommodate five to six people.



The Whitehouse

The Whitehouse serves as another add-on when capacity is reached at the Inn or Eagle's Nest. This retreat house has two bedrooms, a larger meeting area than the Bear Den, and a comfortable front porch. Both the Whitehouse and the Bear Den are a short walk from the Inn.



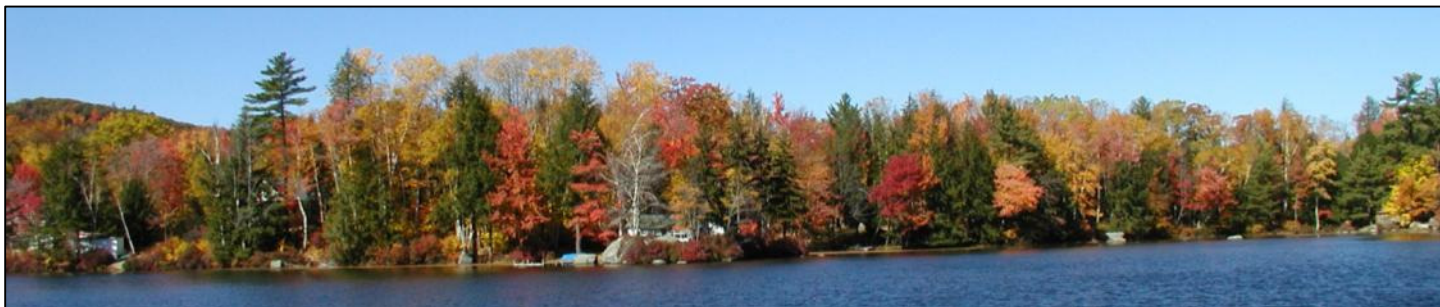
The Gym/Dining Hall

The Gym/Dining Hall is a 2003 addition less than 100 yards from the Inn. While the interior is not completely finished, there is seating to feed 275 people, in addition to a basketball court and a volleyball court. The kitchen staff provides excellent meals from a tried and tested menu, fine tuned to the needs of your group.



The Waterfront on White Pond

The Waterfront on White Pond is open during the summer months through the end of September, or until it gets too cold to permit canoeing.

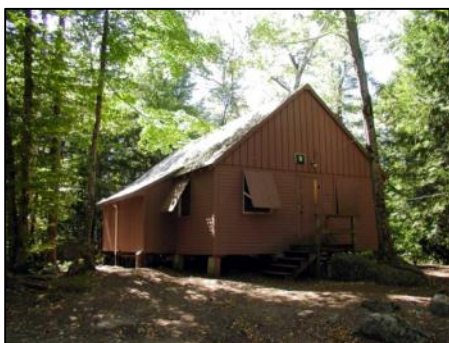


Certified lifeguards patrol the waters during the camping season. Because of the restriction against gas-powered motors on the water, the pond is clean and quiet. The beautiful beach is certainly the central attraction all summer long!



Summer/Seasonal Cabins

Summer/Seasonal Cabins are located throughout the wooded areas of Windsor Hills. There are 11 dormitory style cabins equipped with bunk beds and interior showers/bathrooms. These cabins sleep between 12 and 18 people and are very rustic. The mainstay of our summer camping program for youth, these cabins are also available for weekend retreats during the warmer months or anytime when the summer camping program is out of session.



Smaller Cabins are also available for leadership of retreating groups or for personal prayer retreats. There are 6 different cabins similar to these that can be added on to larger programs or requested for private use. All are equipped with private bathrooms.

Tenting Area

Tenting Area -- There are times, especially during our summer Family Camp Program, when individual families request the use of our lower field for tenting. This area is not available for recreational camping during the rest of the year. It is only a lower-cost housing option for families who are attending a specific program being offered by Windsor Hills. A bathhouse is located nearby for the convenience of those who enjoy roughing it.

The snack shack is a popular feature during the summer months, especially during the youth camping program. Hours of operation vary with the program, when it provides treats and beverages for kids with a sweet tooth. Two Fire-pits are equipped for roasting marshmallows and singing camp songs. The use of these sites is strictly monitored. Permission to kindle fires during the summer months may be restricted by the local fire marshall, dependent on prevailing weather conditions.



The Great Outdoors

Room to run is everywhere. There are several fields for playing soccer or softball. There is an archery grove that is available for groups who have a trained instructor in residence. Skiing is available at nearby Pat's Peak, Henniker, New Hampshire. This family oriented slope has Saturday Night specials that several of our winter groups use annually.
