Make plans now to attend a super week of Christian camping! Windsor Hills is providing an outstanding program that will reach out to every member of the family, in a rustic setting far from the distractions of your normal routine. You'll enjoy family oriented activities, as well as age specific religious instruction and worship experiences.

Dr. Steve Green, Professor of Preaching at Southern Nazarene University will be our preacher for the week. Rev. Mike Schutz, pastor of the Avon Grove Church of the Nazarene will be our Bible Study teacher. Children's ministries will be provided by Rev. and Mrs. Donny Woodbridge. There will be activities for teens, as well as nursery provided during adult service times. This year, the camp will open on Friday so you can arrive early and enjoy some time with your family. Accommodations will be available starting at 4p.m. on Friday with full waterfront activities on Saturday and meals at the Snack Shack on Friday night and Saturday. Full programs for teens and children and Dining Hall meals will begin on Saturday evening.

Accommodations can be reserved by using the attached form. Low family rates are available for some accommodations (Special 8 day week rate) and are listed on the right of the form. This rate applies to whomever you have in your cabin with you, so it is possible for two families to join together and pay one low rate. Both tenting sites and RV sites are still available.

Meals may be purchased individually or by using a meal pass. All reservations are on a first come -- first served basis, so make your plans early!

A \$50 deposit holds your reservations. If you pay your full bill at the time of registration, (before May 15th) you may deduct 3% from the total! Mail completed registration form and check to Sandy Smith at the address listed.

General Rules / Windsor Hills

Christian Conduct is expected at all times. We appreciate your cooperation in the following areas:

CABINS

- ◆ Cooking and refrigeration appliances are not permitted in or allowed to be plugged into any cabins where said appliances have not been installed by Windsor Hills.
- ◆ Please leave your cabin as clean as you find it. If there are maintenance problems, please fill out a maintenance request form in the dining hall.
- ◆ Only those renting rooms in the Inn are permitted in the center section of the Inn.

CLOTHING

- ◆ Shoes and shirts must be worn at all times, except at the beach. Modest apparel must be worn at all times including appropriate swim-wear while at the waterfront. If swim-wear is not appropriate, it must be covered by a T-shirt at all times; while in and out of the water.

DOGS

- ◆ Dogs must be on leashes at all times and you must clean up after your dog.
- ◆ No dogs are to be on the beach or in the water at any time.
- ◆ No dogs are allowed in any building.
- ◆ If your dog is a "barker," please leave it home.

FIRES

- ◆ All fires must be in designated, approved fire pit areas. Be considerate in your use of firewood -- replenish!
- ◆ Outdoor cooking is only permitted in the tenting and RV fields. **You may not cook or grill outdoors by any cabins.**
- ◆ Fire extinguishers are for emergencies only. Illegal usage will result in fines. Fireworks are not permitted on the campground

NOISE

- ◆ No loud music is permitted anywhere, unless it is part of a scheduled program.
- ◆ All Quiet after 11:00 PM. No loud outdoor noise permitted after 10:00PM

SERVICES

- ◆ Activity areas are closed during all services.
- ◆ Food and drinks are not permitted in the Worship Center of the Inn.

WATERFRONT

- ◆ Everyone must observe all posted rules at the waterfront, including the directions of the WHC lifeguards.
- ◆ No swimming is allowed when lifeguard is not on duty. An responsible adult must be present with all children at the beach.
- ◆ To use a canoe, you must be 18 or pass a swimming test. Two adults maximum per canoe only.
- ◆ No one is allowed on the waterfront after dark for any reason.
- ◆ Be courteous to our nearby neighbors. Avoid the docks/beaches of other property owners.
- ◆ Fishing is only permitted when the beach is not open for swimming (except from canoes.) Fishermen under 14 must be supervised. Please keep all tackle off the docks and off the beach area. Be considerate of little swimmers bare feet!

DRIVING

- ◆ You must be a licensed driver, **18 years of age or older**, to drive **any motorized vehicle** on the grounds.
- ◆ Please do not drive in excess of 10 miles per hour anywhere on the grounds.

❖ PROGRAM DONATIONS

This year, to cover the expense of the programs offered for kids, we are requesting a donation for each child involved in the children's and teen's program. We suggest that you give a donation of \$40 for each child involved in the program and \$20 for each teen involved in the program. We also suggest a donation for use of the nursery. Please place donations in the offering plate, or give to the registrar in the Dining Hall.

❖ BICYCLES

This is an experimental year regarding the use of bicycles on the campground. If we have any incidents where people's safety is endangered by the reckless or uncontrolled use of bikes, we will be forced to prohibit their use during our camping sessions. Please park bikes in designated areas only. Observe safety precautions. Bikes, skates, skateboards, etc., are not permitted in the dining hall.

**Parents, please note! Gym is closed 30 minutes before and after every meal.
You are responsible for the conduct of your children while at the camp.**

No one is allowed to possess weapons, tobacco, alcoholic beverages or illegal drugs on the campground at any time. All of the laws of the State of New Hampshire are in force. There is no nurse in residence for Family Camp. This list is not exhaustive, however, it covers the major areas that govern community living.

Please respect other people's space and property at all times.
